

Playing **Pipe Organ Pops**

On the Leif & Bonnie Johnson 4/48 Wurlitzer Theatre Pipe Organ Johnson Mansion, Gig Harbor, WA Sat, Nov. 11th, 2:00 p.m.

Chris Elliott is sought after both as a concert artist and scorer of silent films. One of those rare individuals who is equally at home performing organ literature of the church or theatre, he is one of today's prominent theatre organists.

A native of Santa Ana, California, he graduated with honors from Vanguard University of Southern California (formerly Southern California College), Costa Mesa. While still a student, he held church organ positions in several prominent Southern California churches. For nine years he was a guest artist for the summer noon organ recitals at the Crystal Cathedral where he also assisted with playing weddings and coached with Frederick Swann. Prior to his move to the Bay Area in 1988, he studied with Charles Shaffer in Los Angeles—more recently he coached with celebrated organist and composer Richard Purvis in San Francisco.

In addition to his classical and church organ training, he was privileged to be mentored by everal world-renowned theatre organists, being particularly identified for his association with legendary organist Gaylord Carter, the 'dean' of silent film accompaniment. Chris worked extensively in mastering silent film accompaniment with Mr. Carter who proudly claims Chris as his protégé. In July 1995 at Carter's gala 90th

birthday celebration at Oakland's Paramount Theatre, Chris shared the stage with his mentor in a moving performance that garnered several standing ovations. Excerpts from this event were featured in the documentary "Pulling Out All the Stops: The Pipe Organ in America" seen on PBS television stations.

Chris tours frequently and his performance credits are far-ranging-mighty Wurlitzers in the grandest movie palaces; stunning accompaniments to classic silent films; lauded appearances before conventions of the American Theatre Organ Society; plus brilliant programs on BBC Radio, at the famed Hollywood Bowl and before the Academy of Motion Picture Arts and Sciences.

Chris has six solo recordings to his credit. Bob Shafter in Theatre Organ Journal, said of one of Chris' recordings, "...the best of the best....this recording (will be) one of the few 'classics' in the theatre organ world. It gets the highest possible recommendation."

After a distinguished tenure of eleven years as Senior Organist and Associate Minister of Worship at the Menlo Park Presbyterian Church, in July 1999 Chris began a new, full-time career in the corporate world. He is a Business Analyst in the Procurement organization at Agilent Technologies, and continues to perform organ engagements.

All entries must be played on a theatre pipe organ...sorry, no electronic instruments, please. Your entry will consist of TWO arrangements submitted on one cassette tape. If you have been a first place winner, you are ineligible for further prize positions. You are encouraged, however, to enter in a non-scoring capacity.

Your two selections must not exceed a combined length of 6 minutes. If you

use Dolby noise reduction on your tape, please indicate "Dolby B" or Dolby C" on the tape. Please list the titles, composers and arrangers of the selections on the entry tape. Dan Bellomy will be numbering all entries as they are received to maintain impartiality.

PLEASE INCLUDE a separate card or paper with your name, address, e-mail address and phone number along with a list of your entry selections and the instrument used (i.e., 4/26 Wurlitzer) and its location. Entry tapes will not be returned.






The Grandeur of Wurlitzer Consoles...Part 2

Thanks to our alert readers who identified several of the consoles shown in the September Pipeline—no prizes for you, but we're glad you're paying attention!









Does anyone recognize the unsmiling organist seated at this spectacular console?





Drive directions to Haller Lake Community Club for the Christmas Party

Northbound I-5—Take Exit #174 and turn left onto NE 130th St. Cross over the freeway one long block to 1st Ave. NE, turn left. Drive one block to NE 128th St. Turn right on NE 128th and drive approximately three blocks to Densmore Ave. Turn left on Densmore. The clubhouse is on the right. Park either in front or at the rear of the building.

Southbound I-5—Take Exit #175 onto NE 145th, turn right one block to 1st Ave. NE, turn left. Drive south through NE 130th to NE 128th St. Continue as for Northbound where underlined.

Yet another Seattle theatre meets the wrecking ball...

The Ridgemont Theatre building at Greenwood Avenue and 78th Street will be razed and replaced with a four-story mixed use building that will include 21 condominiums, 2400 square feet of retail space and underground parking for 36 vehicles.

The project is still working its way through the Design Review process: Developers met with neighborhood representatives twice and are also waiting for a decision on the Master Use Permit.

The new building will be called the Ridgemont. As a result, in part because of recommendations from the neighborhood meetings, the developers hope to reuse the old Ridgemont signage but will put a new marquee on the building.

The theatre originally had a 2/6 Kimball (opus 6842) installed in 1923. A. H. Biggs was organist at the Rdgemont in 1927. Popular Northwest organist Ed Zollman played the Ridgemont for several years.

The organ was later moved to an Episcopal Church in Snohomish, Washington, then sold to the National Pipe Organ Trust. Its current status is unknown.
